Good Morning

It is my pleasure to bring you greetings on behalf of the Jamaica Social Investment Fund today! In keeping with our mantra, JSIF is proud to continue its thrust in Investing For Community Development so that; citizens can enjoy better socioeconomic opportunities across several vulnerable communities. We are indeed, committed to supporting this electrification infrastructure initiative which is spearheaded by the Ministry of Local Government and Rural Development and its partners; the Ministry of Education and Youth, Social Development Commission, Rural Water Supply and the National Water Commission.

The Chambers' Pen Rural Electrification Project will be implemented by the Jamaica Social Investment Fund, JSIF through funding support of approximately Twenty-Seven Million Jamaican Dollars (J\$27 M), allotted by the Government Of Jamaica for the Ministry of Local Government and Rural

Development. Under this partnership agreement, to be signed today, with the Ministry of Local Government and Rural Development, JSIF will provide technical support, operational, project management and procurement of expertise to design and construct this community electrification project in Chambers' Pen.

This project seeks to provide vulnerable households with increased access to electricity. In light of this initiative; persons will be able to regularize their electricity by forging a formal agreement with the Jamaica Public Service, JPS which will enable them to be registered on the JPS grid instead of stealing electricity. Most importantly, persons will now be exposed to a safer environment in their homes OR spaces, through the access of legal electricity. The deliverables of this project will include; house wiring through the provision of basic electricity installation and pole line extensions to over three hundred (300) homes over a four-month period.

Of course, this installation process will be conducted by electricians who are

all certified under the Government of Jamaica electrification programme.

Under the **National Electrification Project**, the JSIF had previously implemented several successful initiatives. Consequently, approximately **two thousand**, **five hundred (2,500)** households, from various parishes **will be beneficiaries of this house wiring** and **pole lines extension initative by the end of the period**.

In closing, I urge all our supporting Partners to continue to work together to improve the quality of life of households across communities. Meanwhile, I also ask those community members who are vulnerable to get on board and regularize your electricity supplies.
