My task today is to share with you some income generating ideas which you can undertake with your various groups to help women and families become sustainable. Let me tell you, deciding which type of business to venture into can be a very challenging feat. This choice can determine the outcome of your future business's success, and the right path will depend on multiple factors. My first advise to you is to start a business with an idea that you are passionate about, because it is that passion that will help to sustain you through challenging times.

You will need to research that idea. The gist is to determine if there is a demand for your potential product or service, as well as the type of competition you will be up against. Researching your business idea can help you to identify and counter any potential issues, thereby giving your business the best possible chance of success. Very importantly, you will need to reach out to the various agencies, such as the Small Business Association of Jamaica, the Jamaica Business Development Corporation, the Company's Office of Jamaica, the Rural Agricultural Development Authority and/or other entities that can provide funding and very importantly, capacity development training that will help to enhance your entrepreneurial abilities and strengthen your capacity to operate successful enterprises.

As an Agency that has been active in Community development for over 26 years, the JSIF has engaged with Entrepreneurs who are engaged in animal husbandry, agriculture and fishing, wholesale and retail, beauty care, and even entertainment. Though programmes and projects that are funded by the Government of Jamaica and international donor partners, the JSIF has assisted Small-scale enterprises that are dedicated to the production of soaps, herbs, pastries, clothing, construction materials, cleaning products, confectionery, stationery, beauty and body products. We have also assisted small business owners who are dedicated to agro processing, poultry farming, multimedia production, beauty services, landscaping, haulage and transportation services.

As aspiring entrepreneurs, you must be aware that owning and operating a business require a high level of commitment, endurance, motivation and especially patience that goes into just keeping your businesses afloat, especially in these extremely challenging times. Your vision will not be achieved overnight, but it will be realized if you remain committed, determined and motivated.
