Good morning all:

It is my pleasure to bring you remarks today as we award outstanding microenterprises who benefitted from funding under the first and second cycles of the ICDP II Enterprise Development Grants.

In July 2020, the JSIF in support of the Government of Jamaica's policy to provide economic support to microenterprises and contribute to overall economic growth in Jamaica, decided to provide a boost to small business owners, through funding from the Government of Jamaica's Integrated Community Development Project (ICDP-II). We realized however, that if these enterprises were to succeed, it could not only be about providing financial support as there are other crucial areas where support is necessary to give these enterprises the maximum chance of success. Therefore, a Business Development Support component was incorporated, to include business development training in areas such as Costing, Customer Service, Marketing and Sales, Financial Literacy and Budgeting, Management of business records, and Legal compliance. This Component was vital, as it gave the entrepreneurs a holistic understanding of how to execute strategies to further grow their businesses successfully.

Cycle 3 of the microenterprise project is still in progress, so today, these awardees were selected from Cycles 1 and 11, that benefitted a total of 368 microenterprises in 8 targeted communities in St. James, Clarendon, Kingston, and St. Andrew.
